

Skin moles should not change. Full stop.

If they do, it might be skin cancer.

Tracking your moles is as easy as ABCDEFG...

Asymmetry - Your moles should be perfectly symmetrical. Draw an imaginery line through the middle of your mole to determine the symmetry.

Borders - The edges around your mole should be straight. Any jaggered edges suggests your mole should be checked by a health care professional.

Colour - Your mole should be completely uniform in colour.

Diameter - A mole should be no bigger than the diameter of an eraser on top of a pencil. This is approximately 6mm across.

Evolution - Your mole should look the same as it did a year ago.

Firmness - A healthy mole should be soft and squishy. Any hard parts across the surface of the mole warrants a check.

Growth - Your mole should be the same size as a year ago, and remember the 6mm diameter rule.



If your moles don't tick the boxes above, get them looked at.

Don't forget to check these spots where moles like to hide:

- Scalp
- Behind ears
- Underarms
- Buttocks
- Between toes
- Evelids
- Mouth
- Groin
- Under nails

If you have moles, it's important to have them checked by a dermatologist at regular intervals throughout your life.
